Comments from the Committee Chair

- The Temporary Committee received and reviewed well over 400 Resolutions (nearly 500 pages) covering more than 100 separate topics, as well as Public Testimony from 2 Precinct Delegates.
- The goals of the Temporary Committee included:
 - Review every Resolution.
 - Evaluate and discuss every Resolution for existing coverage by the 2022 RPT Platform.
 - Discuss / debate each Resolution as potential improvements to the 2022 RPT Platform.
 - Prepare a concise report that will get attention by standing out among the 200+ county/SD Platform Committee reports as being concise and quickly understood so that it will receive full due consideration by the RPT State Resolutions Committee. (Note: State platform committee is likely to have many thousands of pages to review from statewide County/SD Committee reports; 200+ reports with 20+ pages per report is 4,000+ pages.)
- The Temporary Committee unanimously adopted the final report.

Repealing the unethical, unconstitutional, unprecedented, and anti-life 25-Day Rule in Section 166.046, Health and Safety Code, and replace it with a truly life-affirming law that requires physicians to adhere to a patient’s or surrogate’s medical decision about life-sustaining treatment and that provides for physicians who disagree with the patient’s decision to transfer the patient to another physician or facility that will honor the decision to continue life-sustaining treatment.
 - b. Improving language that protects Texas patients with disabilities to clarify and strengthen that disability should not be a considered factor.
 - c. Guaranteeing judicial review, ensuring the ability to appeal a hospital committee’s decision and provide impartial legal recourse.”

Our Legislative Priority Committee reviewed these current RPT Legislative Priorities for the 2023-2024 88th Legislative session to assist us in our priority voting process.

The Legislative Priorities for the 88th Session (2023-2024) of the Texas Legislature are:

1. Protect our Elections:

- Restore felony penalties and enact civil penalties for Election Code violations, which shall be enforceable by any Texas jurisdiction, including the Texas Attorney General. Require citizenship verification of each voter. Restrict the distribution of mail-in ballots to only disabled, military, and citizens that are out of state. Reduce the time allowed for early voting, and eliminate the three-day gap between early voting and election day. Establish closed primaries in Texas. As technology evolves, we encourage the passage of legislation that ensures the security of our elections. Sub-Committee Chair [Devvie Duke](#)

2. Secure the Border and Protect Texans:

- Texas shall immediately deny all taxpayer funded services and subsidies to illegal aliens. We call upon the Governor to assert his duty under Article 1, Section 10, Clause 3 of the US Constitution to declare an invasion on our Texas border and do everything in his power to protect Texans from this invasion. The legislature shall direct the Governor to enter into an Interstate Compact with one or more states for Border Security. Sub-Committee Chair [Kelly Perry](#)

3. Ban Gender Modification of Children:

- Texas must ban chemical castration, puberty blockers, cross-sex hormones, genital mutilation, bodily alteration surgery, psychological/social transitioning, and any other methods applied to or performed on children. Sub-Committee Chair [Jill Glover](#)

4. Stop Sexualizing Texas Kids:

- Repeal Texas Penal Code "Obscenity Exemption" 43.24(c), which allows children access to harmful, explicit, or pornographic materials and 43.25(f)(2 3), which allows sexual performance by a child. In addition, prohibit teaching, exposure, and/or discussion of sexual matters (mechanics, feelings, orientation, or "gender identity" issues), and prohibit use or provision of related books and other materials using criminal, civil or other enforcement measures. 5. Ban Democrat Chairs:
 - To ensure all legislative Republican priorities are given a fair opportunity to become law, the Republican-controlled Texas legislature shall adopt a rule that would end the practice of awarding committee chairmanships to Democrats. Sub-Committee Chair [David Wylie](#)

6. Abolish Abortion in Texas:
 - Abolish abortion by ensuring the right to life and equal protection of the laws to all preborn children from the moment of fertilization, including adopting effective tools to ensure the enforcement of our laws to protect life when district attorneys fail to do so. 7. Defend Our Gun Rights:
 - Protect our gun rights against threats, such as red flag laws, federal, state or other restrictions, by strengthening and preserving our inalienable rights under the second amendment to protect our life, liberty and property. 8. Parental Rights and Educational Freedom:
 - Parents are the primary decision makers for their children in all matters. This authority shall be protected as an inalienable right. This shall include the choice of schooling where the money follows the child without strings attached, and enforcement and penalty mechanisms when parents' rights are violated. These priorities were chosen by over 5,000 voting delegates at the state convention, June 13-18, 2022 in Houston, Texas. Delegates were presented with a [list of 15 topics selected by the Legislative Priorities Committee](#) after a comprehensive review of resolutions passed at the precinct and senate district levels of the convention process. Delegates were allowed to vote on 8 topics, which became the official Legislative Priorities of the Republican Party of Texas.

Legislative Priority Voting Methodology Adopted - Committee Reviewed (18) Resolutions recommended by the Temporary Resolutions Committee. We then ranked them individually with a priority score of 1-5, 1 being lowest priority and 5 being highest priority. We based our decisions on the 2024 Primary Resolutions election outcomes, the current RPT Legislative Priorities and our own individual knowledge of the resolutions. We then tallied up all (18) resolutions and determined what 11 resolutions had the highest priority scoring. We determined that the following Resolution numbers in the same numerical order as received by the Temporary Resolution Committee were our recommended committee Legislative Priorities. Item 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 13, 15, 16, 17, & 18.
